

Summer is here, school will soon be out, the pool will be open and ready for kids, baseball and softball games to be played... lots of fun things to do! Remember what it was like to have the whole summer ahead of you? That was a great feeling, wasn't it? I know the residents here are ready for some warm sunny afternoons out in the garden.

This month I would like to talk about medications and some of the rules and regulations that are mandated for Nursing Homes.

State regulations require all over-the-counter medications such as Tylenol, cough drops and syrup, vitamins, and antacids to be ordered by physician. These cannot be kept in resident rooms unless specifically stated in order.

We also use a daily dispensing system from Mercy Long Term Care Pharmacy and it is packaged for a 24-hour time period, labeled individually with resident name, physician name and instructions. Bulk medications are not allowed at Nursing Homes, even though it would be cost-effective. Upon admission we take a snapshot of resident and use that to ensure medication is given to correct resident.

Upon admission, Mercy Long Term Care Pharmacy receives the resident's Medicare Part D information and then will submit monthly charges to Medicare prior to sending statements.

If you have any questions or concerns with your resident's medications or pharmacy statement, please let me know!
